

15th ce Kingdom of Denmark


- Vast Kingdom, small population

- Mid 15th ce uprisings in Sweden
 - "Fortinbras of Norway"
- Increasing control of Church











Kirtle

The first fashion layer,
ALWAYS worn with a surcote
overtop. Sometimes visible,
sometimes not. Different sleeve
types: short long, and
connected by lacing.

Headdress


Married Women always wore veils. The 15thc saw an increase in fashionable hair styling through headdresses using fillets, escoffion, bourrelets, hennins and more.

Surcote

The outermost fashion layer (not including cloaks). The houppelande was common but was gradually changed throughout the century, Late... 15th ce added a waist seam... Usually fasten with a Belt... or "Girdle"
